The Service Committee decided to do a themed ALL CLUB SERVICE project and will invite all members at our September business meeting to help donate to our collection drive of Blankets, Bears (stuffed animals) and children's books to bring to our Oct 5th business meeting and Oct 19 Service Meeting. The items will go to Huffer and Teddy Bear early learning centers mid-October. Our goal is to collect enough for 200 underserved daycare children. ProgramMeeting

In case you were unable to attend the September Program Meeting here is a summary of what we learned....(With this being our 100th Year Anniversary of the Muncie Club, I am asking the Program Presenters to follow along with that mentality.)

How does The Soup Kitchen of Muncie support Muncie, Delaware County?

The Soup Kitchen has been feeding the hungry in our community for 29 years, without regard to race, gender, religion, or sexual preference. Five days a week, we offer a hot meal and a take-home sack lunch to every person who walks through our doors.

We serve between 150 and 200 people a day. In 2022, we served 65,000 meals to Muncie's most vulnerable population. We also have partnerships to provide meals to the YWCA and Recovery Café. The Soup Kitchen operates in one of Delaware County's several food deserts. In 2020, Feeding America reported that 17,320 individuals in Delaware County were food insecure, which is a 15.1 percent food insecurity rate.

What has the Altrusa Club done in the past to support The Soup Kitchen?

Altrusa Club has provided the food and packed sack lunches for as many years as I have been in the kitchen and before. Once a quarter, the Service Committee and other members of Altrusa have gathered early on a designated Monday morning to make sandwiches and pack other items in sacks to deliver to the kitchen.

What can Altrusans do in the future to continue to support The Soup Kitchen?

Packing sack lunches is really a big help to us. As food costs have risen with inflation in the last several years, your packed lunches have helped further spread our food dollars.

Coming to volunteer to help us cook and/or serve would be a great service to us and also help the club learn more about what we do. Donations are always needed either as a group or individually. Helping us navigate the grant application would be a great asset to us as we seek every possible way to raise funds.

Altrusa Foundation of Muncie announces availability of Impact Grant

Beginning October 15, 2023, Altrusa Foundation of Muncie will open a high-impact grant opportunity for one nonprofit in the amount of \$10,000.

"The nonprofit organizations in our community do such outstanding work! As the Altrusa Foundation board of directors considered how to mark 40 years of grant making, we thought

who better to celebrate than our amazing nonprofits that accomplish meaningful work every day, generating lasting impact for Muncie and Delaware County," said Jennifer Johnson, Grant Committee Chair.

The Altrusa Foundation Grant Committee will begin accepting applications October 15, 2023. Eligible organizations must be a 501©(3) nonprofit organization located in Delaware County requesting funding for educational and other charitable purposes. Funds may be used to develop new programs or to fund existing programs. The application deadline is December 15, 2023. A one-time award of \$10,000 will be awarded to one nonprofit organization. Up to 3 finalists will be chosen to give a 10-minute presentation to the Altrusa Foundation Board on January 16, 2024. Finalists will be notified by January 8, 2024.


